GDPR Live Streaming Forms for Volunteers – We have been informed by our Diocesan Data Compliance Manager that the rules regarding live streaming have been updated. Each church has to have clear signage that live streaming is present and indicating clearly the field of view of the camera (please see the poster on the noticeboard) however now any volunteers whose image would be identifiable online (e.g. altar servers, readers and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion etc.) must sign a consent form. Consent from a parent/guardian is required for children under 16. If this applies to you please speak to Fr Tomas and he will give you a form.

Blessing of Vehicles – We believe that God takes interest in our daily lives and indeed we can seek his blessing on the items we use on daily basis and in this way we consecrate them to him. It's good practice to have your new car (and other vehicles) blessed by a priest and part of the blessing is also a prayer for God's protection. You can ask a priest for such a blessing any time but the traditional date for this is on or around the feast of St Christopher. As this falls on this Friday, next Sunday, after the 11am Mass, Fr Tomas will offer this blessing to those who wish it. Simply gather at the carpark after the Mass.

Feast of St James the Greater (25th July) – Among the Twelve Apostles were two named James: James, the son of Zebedee and James, the son of Alpheus. The former is traditionally called James the Greater, and the latter is traditionally called James the Lesser, perhaps because of the greater importance James the Greater played in the Gospel narrative. St James the Greater was called to be an Apostle by Jesus along with his brother St John. It was this James who, with John and Peter, witnessed the Raising of the Daughter of Jairus, the Lord's Transfiguration on Mount Tabor, and

His agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. After Jesus' Resurrection and Ascension, St James was instrumental in preaching the Gospel with throughout the Roman Empire, even, according to tradition, as far as the Iberian Peninsula. Later, James returned to Jerusalem but was martyred for his faith by King Herod Agrippa. His body made its way to Spain where he was buried. His relics are now enshrined in Santiago de Compostela which has become and continues to be one of the most popular Christian places of pilgrimage.

Have a look where the nearest catholic church is to you are staying or even find a nice church a bit further away and make a nice day trip out of it. Lots of touristy destinations abroad will also have Sunday Mass in English.

Parish Feast Day – Please put into your diaries <u>Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> September</u>. The 11am Mass that day will be celebrated as an external solemnity of <u>The Birthday of Our Lady</u> and also as our patronal feast day. Following the solemn Mass we are hoping to organise a <u>parish party / BBQ</u>. More information will follow and I'm hoping as many of you as possible will be able to make that day.

Mass Intentions – The Mass is the greatest prayer because it is the perfect offering of Christ to the Father, making present the Paschal Mystery of His death and resurrection. It is a longstanding tradition in the Church that a Priest may be requested to offer a Mass for a specific intention, even if you can't physically be present at that Mass. You can ask for mass to be offered for the Repose of the Soul of the deceased, in thanksgiving, for the sick or any other good intention. If you would like to have a mass offered for your intention, please use one of the mass intention envelopes available at the back of church. It is customary to offer a donation (typically about £10) for the priest who offers mass for your intention. Envelopes can either be handed to the priest or put into the presbytery letterbox.

## OTHER PARISH ITEMS

If you are going into hospital, please contact Fr Tomas in order to receive the sacrament of the Sick before you go. When you are admitted to the hospital, you will have to explicitly ask for the catholic chaplain to be informed you are there.

If you know of a parishioner with a serious/long-term illness or who is dying, please let Fr Tomas know so that he can get in touch and arrange a visit.

**Food Bank** – There is a basket at the back of the church where you can leave non-perishable items that will then be given to The Well, our local Food Bank.
